What To Do This Summer

Although the heat and humidity are upon us and many ceilis are not held during the summer, there are still some chances to get out and dance around town.

J Patrick's Pub in Locust Point, Baltimore, MD, continues its second Sunday ceili all summer with the J Patrick's All Star Ceili Band. The pub is air conditioned and Joe Byrne has added a few more ceiling fans to keep the cool air circulating. Ceilis run from 4:30 to 8:30 pm so there's plenty of time to get home on a Sunday night.

GWCC has its Mini-Ceilis on the 3rd Thursday of July and August at the Frost Center in Rockville, MD. Tina Eck, Rob Greenway and Philippe Varlet are always on hand to provide stellar dance tunes. The Frost Center is also air conditioned so even the fastest polkas are enjoyable!

In addition to local dancing, there are a number of good concerts and dance performances slated for June, July and August. CCE MAD Week has its concert at McGinty's Publick House in Silver Spring on July 7th. The Culin School of Traditional Irish Dance presents its spectacular production *Traidisiún: An Irish Dance Show*, June 18-19 at the Takoma Park Campus of Montgomery College.

If you are looking after a more adventurous event this summer and are willing to travel... there are a number of fine Irish Festivals across the country.

Catskills Irish Arts Week: Celebrating its 16th year in 2010, the Catskills Irish Arts Week will take place July 11-17 in the Irish Catskill Mountains centered in the historic Irish American resort town of East Durham in upstate New York. The CIAW is an exciting blend of over sixty classes in traditional Irish music and dance taught by a very distinguished faculty recruited in Ireland, the U.S. and Canada making it the largest summer school in North America devoted to the Irish Traditional Arts. In addition to the morning and afternoon classes offered Monday to Friday, there are daily topical lectures on Irish music and dance, nightly outdoor concerts in the Quill Centre Pavilion, Roadhouse Ceilis and sessions galore that take place all week in and around the hamlet of East Durham in the heart of the Irish Catskills.

Augusta Irish Arts Week: Irish/Celtic Week celebrates its 29th year, July 25-30, 2010, with the very best in Celtic crafts, folklore, music and dance. Augusta's Irish/Celtic Week has had an enormous impact on the quality of Irish and Cape Breton traditional music and dance in the U.S. The classes are intense and music sessions in the wee hours are legendary. Irish/Celtic Week Coordinator Joanie Madden has chosen extraordinary master musicians and teachers for the week. Students choose one subject and one instructor for intensive classes that meet both morning and afternoon. All classes (except dance and vocals) are intended for those who can already play their instrument to some extent and are ready to start learning Irish or Celtic style, technique, and repertoire. 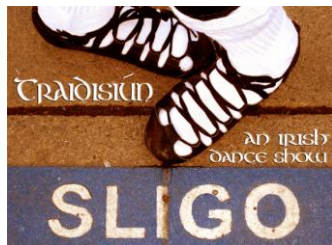

We decided to end the ceili year with a "big band" ceili, and our musicians did not disappoint! Our band consisted of Tina Eck, Joe DeZarn, Peter Brice, Marc Glickman, Jesse Winch and Patrick Cavanagh, and the tunes were applause-worthy all night long! Before the ceili, Dick de Freyre took all interested dancers through a Paris Set refresher. And then we were off!

The "all sets" evening began with the Clare Plain Set, the North Kerry Set, and the Connemara Reel Set. The pot luck tables overflowed with goodies, both savory and sweet. The second set of dances started with the Cashel Set, and continued with a beautiful waltz and the Clare Mazurka Set. We began the last set of dances with a lively Paris Set, followed by the Ballyvourney Jig Set. The evening ended with our traditional Clare Lancers Set, and the national anthems of Ireland and the US. Nobody wanted the evening to end, and everyone commented on what a lovely time they had.

On the first weekend in June, GWCC dancers participated for the third time in the Western Maryland Celtic Festival in Deep Creek Lake. Although the rains came down in the morning, we were nice and dry in a new dance venue (the old one collapsed under snow this winter!), and did our usual combination of performance pieces and audience participation. The festival had a nice selection of Celtic vendors, all nicely under cover, and assorted Celtic hounds and cattle. A feature of this festival is a noon massing of pipe bands who sounded great together. The weather improved somewhat in the afternoon, so the festival did get a good number of attendees.

If you just can't get enough dancing, the "Sweats of Summer" continue on Thursday evenings at the Frost Center through August 19th. For more information, contact Paul O'Donnell at 301.649.6410. There will be ongoing construction at Frost this summer, and there will be a couple of weeks with alternate sites. If you plan to "drop in" for a class or a mini-ceili, it's a good idea to check first on location. The Wind That Shakes the Barley: Another look at the “Terrible Beauty”

When I was in the 5th grade in the late 1950’s, our teacher, Sister Kevin, told us about the Black and Tans. Sister was old, probably in her late 50’s then, Irish, and the meanest teacher I ever encountered in all my many years of schooling. She was disgusted that we American girls couldn’t “roll” our R’s when we practiced the Irish songs she had taught us for the pastor’s jubilee. She piled on so much homework there was no way to get it done every night. And humiliation was her forte. But when she told us about the ruthless soldiers who terrorized her country during what must have been her girlhood, she drew us (me, at least) in and the frustration she must have felt trying to teach a combined class of nearly sixty 5th and 6th graders, subsided. During those times her anger was directed at the “Tans.”

If Sister Kevin’s “Tans” were anywhere near as violent as the ones in ***The Wind That Shakes the Barley***, I can understand how 40 years on she was still angry.

The depiction of the graphic violence the Black and Tans visit on the Irish country folk in the early scenes of the film rivals the gore in the opening ½ hour of ***Saving Private Ryan***. A young man is beaten to death because he won’t say his name in English. A train guard is beaten because he refuses to allow soldiers on the train. When Dan (Liam Cunningham), the train conductor, also resists allowing the soldiers on his train, he, too, is beaten. The Tans need little provocation to mete out mayhem and murder. After witnessing the incident at the train, Damien O'Donovan (Cillian Murphy) decides he can no longer ignore what is happening in his home country. So rather than go off to London to work as a doctor, he joins the IRA brigade his brother, Teddy (Padraic Delaney), belongs to.

One wishes that after the violence of the Black and Tans, the Republicans would have been united on all fronts. But we know they weren’t. Remember

Michael Collins. Irish men and women were bitterly divided on whether to accept the terms of the new Irish Free State, which would have replaced British rule with local control, but did not give Ireland full independence. A civil war ensued, and like most civil wars, the division pitted brother against brother and friend against friend. Filmed in the lush green counties of Cork, Killarney, and Kerry, the Ireland of ***The Wind That Shakes the Barley*** is indeed a “terrible beauty.”

Murphy, Delaney, Cunningham, and Orla Fitzgerald, who plays Sinéad Sullivan, Damien’s love interest and sister of the slain youth, give credible performances, leaving little doubt about the emotional havoc the troubled times wreaked upon the natives. As it must have been during the Irish Civil War, there aren’t any winners in the film. The film also raises universal questions about how people decide on the justness of a cause and whether the human cost of it is worth the outcome. It’s a darkly emotional 2 hour and 7 minute long foray into one of the bleakest periods of Irish history.

A multi-national effort, Ken Loach’s 2006 ***The Wind That Shakes the Barley***, won the Palme d’Or at the Cannes Film Festival that year. There’s no sex, but plenty of “F” bombs in the unrated film, classified as military/war/action. 4 stars, rather than 5 for gratuitous violence
